Program Options:

Associate of Applied Science Degree in Electric Power Generation Technology
Certificate in Electric Power Generation Technology

Degree Applicants:

Students who pursue the EPG AAS degree must first earn an AAS degree in one of the programs listed below and may apply to earn a second AAS degree.

Approved programs for the first degree:

- Automotive Technology
- Aviation Maintenance
- CAT Dealer Service Technician Option
- Electrical Distribution Systems
- Electronics Engineering Technology
- Industrial Electricity
- Heavy Equipment Technology
- Medium/Heavy Truck Technology
- Powersports Technology

Certificate Applicants:

Those who have gained fundamental mechanical, electrical, or electronic skills through other means such as industry experience or college studies may apply for the EPG certificate program.

Applications requirements for LSTC graduates and LSTC students:

For priority consideration in the EPG program, all of the items listed below must be received by the Office of Admissions by February 29. Candidates may submit applications after February 29, but those applications will not be given preference.

1. Easy Application for Admission, available in the Office of Admissions.
 - a. List school and/or work activities on your application.
2. LSTC Transcript, the Office of Admissions will request this on your behalf from the Student Records Office.

Note: Admission into EPG is competitive – for consideration into EPG you should work to maintain a high LSTC grade point average, job readiness/work ethic score, and class attendance percentage.

3. Test Scores: Submit either ACT, SAT (Critical Reading + Math and Writing) or COMPASS test scores.
 - a. Test scores are used for course placement and program admittance.
 - b. **Associate of Applied Science Degree Requirements:**

4. Bennett Mechanical Test. Contact the Office of Admissions to schedule your testing appointment if you have not already taken this test.
5. Applicants will be contacted for an interview.

Application Requirements for All Others:

1. Application for Admission, available online at www.linnstate.edu (no application fee).
2. Education Record - Submit all that apply to you:
 - High School students are given tentative admission based on a sixth or seventh semester transcript. After high school graduation, a final original transcript must be mailed directly from your high school to the Office of Admissions. The final transcript must be in a sealed, unopened envelope (not faxed) and should include the date of graduation, final GPA, school seal, and signature of school official.
 - Missouri GED score reports will be obtained by the Admissions Office. Faxed copies are not accepted. GED graduates outside of Missouri should request that the State Department of Education in the capital city of the state in which they tested send an official copy of their GED Score Report to the Office of Admissions.
 - Home-school graduates that do not have a GED score report should contact the Office of Admissions for information regarding the "ability to benefit."
 - Transfer students:
 - Students with less than 24 credit hours need to submit college transcripts and high school transcripts.
 - Students with more than 24 credit hours need to submit college transcripts only.
3. Completed High School Attendance Record form signed by your high school counselor. Transfer students and students who earned GEDs rather than high school diplomas do not need to submit the high school attendance record form.
4. Test Scores: Submit either ACT, SAT (Critical Reading + Math and Writing) or COMPASS test scores.
 - a. Test scores are used for course placement and program admittance.
 - b. Certificate Requirements:

 - c. The COMPASS test is offered on the Linn State Technical College campus most Wednesdays. Contact the Office of Admissions to set up an appointment. The charge is \$10.00. To prepare for the test, visit www.act.org/compass/sample.
 - d. Check www.actstudent.org for ACT test locations, fees, and details for registering for the test. LSTC is a testing location and our test code is 5105.
